Camper Equipment List

The following items should be brought by all campers and packed in a footlocker, backpack or duffel bag:

- Scout uniform (*as complete of a uniform as possible should be worn by each Scout when they arrive at camp*)
- Minimum of four changes of clothing
- Pair of long pants or sweat pants
- 1 sweatshirt or sweater
- 1 light to medium weight jacket
- 2 extra changes of underwear
- 2 extra changes of socks
- 2 extra T-shirts
- 1 extra pair of shoes, boots or sneakers
- At least one swimsuit
- Beach towel
- Poncho or raincoat
- Sleeping bag or 2-4 warm blankets
- Pillow
- Towel and face cloth
- Soap and shampoo
- Comb
- Toothbrush and toothpaste
- Flashlight
- Mosquito netting and poles (may be purchased at Scout Shop)
- Insect repellent (non-aerosol)
- Sunscreen
- Laundry bag or trash bag for dirty clothes
- Day pack
- Spending money (suggest \$25 max.)
- Canteen or water bottle

HOW TO PACK

Put each day's clothes in a separate bag, with each bag labeled with the day it is to be worn. Also put one extra set of clothes in another bag marked "extra." Place the bags in the boy's footlocker, backpack, or duffel bag with "Monday" on top. **All items should be marked with the camper's name.**

WHAT NOT TO BRING

- Pocket knives (unless held by the unit leader—4½" max; no fixed blades)
- Sheath knives
- Pets
- Cell phones
- Radios, CD or digital music players
- Electronic games
- Squirt guns
- Un-Scout-like literature
- Alcoholic beverages
- Illegal drugs

PRESCRIPTION MEDICATION

Any medication that will need to be taken during the session must be given to the health and safety officer on Sunday during the check-in process. *Only medications in their original containers with the patient's name, doctor's name, and date on the label will be accepted. If for some reason a dosage changes, a doctor's note is required. No exceptions!*

PLEASE NOTE: Campers and adults that require Epi-Pens or inhalers may keep the medication with them *as long as a physician and parent/guardian has signed the required permission slip (please see your pack leader or visit www.nhscouting.org/camping for the form).* **In addition, a second Epi-Pen and/or inhaler must be provided to the health and safety officer when checking-in on Sunday.**
